Frequently Asked Questions (And Their Answers!)

Q: When and where is the Europe Pharmacy Training Symposium being held?

A: The Europe Pharmacy Training Symposium is being held 31 May – 2 June 2019 at the Edelweiss Lodge and Resort Hotel in Garmisch-Partenkirchen, Germany

Q: Are the hotel rooms being paid centrally through RHC-E?

A: No, the hotel rooms are NOT being booked by RHC-E and RHC-E is NOT paying for the rooms. Each participant is responsible for paying for their own hotel room and claiming reimbursement through DTS. Participants must call the hotel directly and reserve their room under the special code section "1805PHARMA." Room reservations were due last week on Wednesday- 18 April 2018 (after this date, we cannot guarantee the availability of a room). If individuals have made a reservation and wish to not attend the conference, they must contact the Eidelweiss hotel directly and cancel their reservation by 3 May 2018.

Q: Who is funding the military personnel?

A: Funding to the symposium for military personnel is through each local MTF? Your chain of command should have submitted a TDY approval packet through your local chain of command. Please refer all military TDY requests through your local Pharmacy Chain of Command.

Q: Who is funding Dept of Army (DA) GS civilian Pharmacists and Pharmacy Technicians?

A: The MEDCOM CP53 office is funding all DA GS civilian Pharmacist and Pharmacy Technicians. However, all civilians who wanted to attend must have submitted their GoArmyEdu accounts by last Friday- 20 April 2018. If you did not submit your GoArmyEdu account by last Friday, then funding will be a personal expense. Once the CP53 office has processed the GoArmyEdu requests, you will receive additional guidance from Mr. Jerry Salyers on how to process your DTS orders.

Q: Are Pharmacy Technicians funded to attend?

A: Depends. Military Pharmacy Technicians must be preapproved through their local MTF for approval. GS civilian Pharmacy Technicians are funded using CP53 funds. However, the GS civilians must have already registered through GoArmyEdu by 20 April 2018.

Q: Can I go on TDY without a Government Travel Card (GTC)?

A: **All attendees must have a Government Travel Card (GTC). Therefore, all must apply for a GTC NOW!** DoD policy is for all DoD Personnel (military and civilian) to have a Gov't Travel Card (040101). Once the application is received by LRMC or the BMEDDAC GTC office, then the online portion of the application must be completed. The card will arrive in about 2-3 weeks. If the application is expedited, it will still take about a week because of the normal delays in mail. Local Nationals (LN) cannot have a Gov't Travel Card. LN will need to contact their Pharmacy Chain of Command's on how to process their TDY authorizations and vouchers.

Q: Is transportation reimbursed?

A: No, all participants are expected to reserve a TMP. Pharmacy OIC's shall ensure Drivers of TMPs receive adequate sleep prior to driving and will adjust work schedules to ensure drivers report later in the duty day to ensure full rest. Individuals who wish to travel in their own POV will not be reimbursed for their travel. Rental cars are not authorized.

Q: Will I receive per diem?

A: Yes, since all attendees have to have an approved DTS authorization. Travelers will receive 75% MI&E on Friday and Sunday and a proportional meal rate for Saturday. Breakfast and Lunch on Saturday and Sunday is provided and included in the room rate. When processing DTS orders, participants shall select Meals provided for Breakfast and Lunch on Saturday and Sunday 19 & 20 May 2018 (participants will be provided a Proportional Meal Rate for Saturday).

Q: What is the uniform for the symposium?

A: Military personnel will wear ABUs/OCPs on Saturday during the symposium and Civilian personnel will wear business casual. Military uniforms are not allowed to be worn while traveling or participating in any off-base social event (therefore bring civilian clothes for Friday and Saturday evenings just in case you want to go off post and visit the town). Due to travel requirements, military personnel will travel down in civilian clothes on Friday and are authorized to wear business casual on Sunday. **Don't forget to bring your Dirndl or Lederhosen for Saturday night**

Q: Do I have to share a room?

A: Due to different funding sources, military personnel are expected to share a room with another individual of the same rank (i.e. <E4 with <E4, etc) and gender. DA GS civilian personnel funded through the CP53 office may have their own room (Single Room Rate= \$176.50). Military personnel may work with MSgt Timothy R. Schnur with requesting a room-mate (timothy.r.schnur.mil@mail.mil). Military personnel requesting a private room are expected to pay the difference between the double vs. single rate. Single room rate per night=\$176.50 vs. Double room rate per occupancy per night= \$113.00.

Q: Do I get Comp Time (CT) for the symposium?

A: Military personnel do not get CT. GS Civilian personnel may receive CT for travel plus 12.25 hours of CT for the training (8.25 for Saturday + 4 hrs for Sunday).

Q: Will I receive ACPE credits for the training?

A: Yes, the agenda is being finalized. Attendees can expect to receive ~12 ACPE credits. Participants wanting ACPE credits must bring their NABP numbers to the conference and complete all required symposium surveys.

Q: What time does the symposium start?

A: The educational sessions will begin at 0745 on Saturday- 1 June 2019, and will begin on Sunday at 0800. The symposium will end at 1200 on Sunday- 2 June 2019.

Q: Are there any social events?

A: Yes. Please join us Friday night from 1900-2200 for a welcoming reception at the Zuggy's Base Camp lounge at the Edelweiss hotel for appetizers and drinks. Additionally, there will be an off-site group dinner on Saturday night in Garmisch at a location to be announced.
